

Aliens, Capitalism, Science, Drugs, Hubris








"The apocalypse sure beats a nine-to-five?"



I hope my message finds you well, we are well in lab 4, but we have found something that may be of great interest to you. Last monday, our geologist discovered a massive metal capsule. The capsule (diagrams of which I have provided) is perfectly smooth aside from a small porthole set in a panel which we correctly identified as a door. 








Due to the discovery of an unidentified object in June, McMurdo station has elected to remain operational into the winter months. Object QR47, also known as The Capsule, has been under investigation for the past several months since its discovery in the ice. The material it is composed of has still yet to be identified, a potential phrase has been gleaned from the text inside the capsule, and most of innards have been shipped off to other labs to be studied more closely. The team at McMurdo lab 4 is left now with Object QR47, as well objects QR49 and QR50. Little revelations have taken place surrounding QR47, it's become increasingly obvious that in order to use the capsule we will require a fuel that does not exist yet. The entire outside is smooth, and the inside similarly, without any bolts or rivets. It's as if the capsule was picked from a tree as it is. Our next course of action in that regard is to attempt to break into its inner workings, perhaps find more information about this unusual alloy.
